As Managing Director of Dream Agrobusiness Limited, she has transformed northern Mozambique's agriculture by promoting sustainable practices, social inclusion, and market access. Through global partnerships, she strengthens rural communities, combats hunger, and drives economic growth. Her initiatives include an industrial complex to complete the agricultural value chain, empowering 50,000 small-scale farmers by 2028, and a reforestation project to plant 100,000 trees. A senior consultant, speaker, and trainer, Rukssana shapes Mozambique's agribusiness sector. She chairs the Agribusiness Department of the Confederation of Economic Associations (Niassa province), is a Chamber of Commerce member, and serves on the Interministerial Committee for the Special Processing Zone for Agro-industry.
